#### JRM AWARD



The prestigious John Ross Matheson Award is an award to those heroes of our fraternity who have best exemplified a continued commitment of distinguished service to their community, country and mankind. A

maximum of two awards are granted annually, and only 29 have been presented since its inception.

At a ceremony during the fall reunion of the Barrie Consistory, SGC Terry McLean and Awards Chairman Skip Whitely presented Valley of Barrie member Brian Shannon with the John Ross Matheson Award. Brian is the third member of our Valley to receive this prestigious honour, joining Doug Jagges (2011) and Ken Veitch (2013) as part of a very exclusive group.

Born in Hamilton in 1946, after graduating from the University of Western Ontario Brian and his wife Dale moved to Toronto, on to Caledon, and finally to Meaford. Brian worked for the Government of Ontario for 20 years in a variety of positions including Executive Director of Corporate Services at the Ontario Science Centre. His community activities include a long list of volunteerism in both Peel Region and the Meaford area. He has been involved in (and often chaired) organizations such as Supportive Housing, Headwaters Health Care Centre, CCAC, minor hockey, Standardbred Breeders, Ontario Sires Stakes, Interprovincial Lottery Corporation, Lakeshore Football Officials Association, and is very active in the Meaford United Church.

Brian and Dale have been married for 45 years and have 3 children and 5 grandchildren. A four-time Master of Peel Lodge No. 468, Brian was Appointed Grand Steward in 2007. He received his 32° in the Barrie Consistory in 1978, he remains very active in numerous degrees, he received his 33° in 2006 in Halifax, and he has served as the Grand Secretary for the Valley of Barrie since 2008. He is currently serving on the Board of Directors of the Barrie Learning Centre.

Yes, he certainly has been an active and busy individual, and we congratulate Brian Shannon on this prestigious honour as a JRM Award recipient.



#### LEARNING CENTRE REPORT



The Barrie Learning Centre provides free remedial tutoring to children with difficulties in reading and writing - formally identified as dyslexia. Our Learning Centre continues to flourish, both in Barrie and at our second location in Bracebridge. We are currently tutoring 21 young people in Barrie and another 4 in Bracebridge. The future looks bright indeed for the Barrie Learning Centre!

This year saw the retirement of three valued members from the Board of Directors - *Paul Fockler, Steve Martin and John Slessor*. Their years of dedication to the Learning Centre has been most appreciated and their various talents will be missed. The contributions made by these individuals has been very significant. Thank you!

We have been fortunate to welcome four new members to the Board in the persons of *Brian Laporte, Joe DeMello, Brian Shannon and Sheila West-Merker*. They join returning Board members *David Boyd, John Harrison, Rodney Greer, Doug Jagges, Nancy Ortieb, Robert Brethour, Bruce Fraser, John McKillip and Don Coates*, giving our Learning Centre a strong group of leaders as we continue to expand our efforts in helping young people overcome the challenges of dyslexia. There remains a need for both

tutors and volunteers at the Learning Centre, so please contact Centre Director Ross Martin (705-325-1708) if you or someone you know would like to assist in our efforts to help these young people.

#### **Muskoka Tutoring Rooms**

Operational since January of 2015, the Barrie Learning Centre's *Muskoka Tutoring Rooms* hosted a Grand Opening Event on Wednesday, June 3<sup>rd</sup>. This 3-year pilot project authorized by the SRCF is the first of its kind in Canada whereby we are offering tutoring to young people at a remote location - but still under the auspices and responsibility of the Barrie Learning Centre. At the Learning Centre, children with dyslexia learn to read.


ensuring we are all able to enjoy a safe and secure environment in which to meet. They deserve our thanks and support for all of their dedication and efforts.
